

ORDINANCE NO. 2007-01

**AN ORDINANCE CHANGING AND AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF LANSFORD, SPECIFICALLY CHAPTER 13, PART 4 (ORDINANCE NO. 92-1), "TRANSPORTATION OF HOUSEHOLD GOODS."**

**BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED** by the Borough Council of the Borough of Lansford, the Code of Ordinances of the Borough of Lansford, Chapter 13, Part 4, Transportation of Household Goods, is hereby amended, revised, repealed or added as follows:

PART 4

**TITLE: MOVING PERMITS AND TRANSPORTATION OF HOUSEHOLD AND COMMERCIAL GOODS**

**SECTION 401: Permit Required to Move Goods, Equipment or Machinery.**

No person or persons, firm or corporation, shall move or cause to be moved from anyplace within the Borough of Lansford to another place therein, or to anyplace beyond the limits thereof, or from anyplace outside the limits of the Borough of Lansford to anyplace within the Borough any household goods, personal goods, equipment, machinery or commercial goods in bulk in connection with the relocation or termination of a place of business or residence, without first securing, from the Borough Secretary of the Borough of Lansford, Carbon County, a permit for such moving or transportation of household or commercial goods.

**SECTION 402: Application for Permit**

Any person or persons, firm or corporation desiring a permit for the removal of or transportation of household goods, personal goods, equipment, machinery or commercial goods in the manner described in Section 401 above, shall make application to the Borough Secretary of the Borough of Lansford, Carbon County, Pennsylvania, setting forth his, her, its or their name or names and addresses, and also setting forth the names of the owner(s) or reputed owner(s) of the property to be moved, the address and location from which the property is to be moved and the new address or location of the place to which the property is to be moved.

**SECTION 403: Issuance of Permit; Fee:**

The Borough Secretary of the Borough of Lansford, Carbon County, shall upon due compliance with the requirements set forth above in Section 402 of Part 4, Chapter 13, shall issue a permit for which a charge, as set forth from time to time by resolution of Borough Council, will be made, setting forth the name of the applicant, as well as the name or names of the owners of the personal goods, household goods, or commercial goods, equipment or machinery to be moved and the address from which the personal goods, household goods, or commercial goods, equipment or machinery are to be moved and the address to which the personal goods, household goods, or commercial goods, equipment or machinery are to be delivered.

**SECTION 404:            Enforcement**

The provisions of this Chapter 13, Part 4 shall be enforced by the Mayor, Code Enforcement Official, Police Department, or by any such other person as may be designated by the Borough Council.

**SECTION 405:            Penalty for Violation**

Any person, persons, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Part or Section, or found furnishing false information to the Borough Secretary, or using false name or address, shall, upon conviction thereof before any Magisterial District Judge of the County, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than six hundred dollars (\$600.00) and costs of prosecution, and in default of such fine and costs, be subject to imprisonment in jail for a term not to exceed thirty (30) days. Each day that a violation of this Part or Section continues shall constitute a separate offense.

**SECTION 406:            Severability**

In the event any provision, section, sentence, clause or part of this ordinance shall be held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect or impair any remaining provision, section, sentence, clause or part of this ordinance, it being the intent of this Borough that such remainder shall be and shall remain in full force and effect.
